Tom Ferry, Municipal Auditor, presented an overview of the 2015 Sussex Borough Audit Report and went over the following comments and recommendations from the audit:

<u>COMMITTEE & LIAISON REPORTS:</u> <u>Mayor Little</u> opened the floor to each member of the Council to offer their respective committee reports.

Mrs. Masson stated that she attended a SCMUA meeting on July 6th and they were again discussing a hardship agreement with Vernon. SCMUA held an E-Waste program on June 18th and they had 1360 vehicles and they took in 75 tons in 7 hours. Their solid waste tonnage was up 6.5% over 2015, their revenue was up 6.1% and they cancelled their August 17th meeting. We recently received a \$360,000 water/sewer grant, I would like to thank the grant committee and particularly Annette Stendor who brought Bruno and Associates to Sussex Borough and pushed very hard until the council hired them in late April 2015. Now we are up to a total of \$760,000 in 15 months which I think is an excellent return on our investment.

Mr. Meyer stated that there was an EDU committee meeting prior to this meeting which was requested by BoBo Kitchen asking to reduce their seating from 24 to 20 seats. The committee is recommending that the EDU rate be reduced from 3.80 to 2.80 edu's and additionally we are requesting that the restaurant seats be recounted by the Borough by September 1st and impose a penalty for non-compliance for people increasing the amount of their edu's after the count is done.

Mrs. Stoll stated that there was not a Recreation meeting due to not enough members present. Miss Sussex and Little Miss were in the paper yesterday and it will be in the Advertiser News on Thursday.

Mr. Dykstra stated that there is a Board of Health meeting scheduled for July 28th and a court session scheduled August 8th.

<u>Mr. Holowach</u> stated that the DPW repaired the stairs that lead to the Harrison Street parking lot. There is a sink hole on Brookside Avenue that the DPW is working on getting repaired through the State of NJ DOT.

Clove Lake/Brook Maintenance did a cleanup of Clove Lake for the water chestnut invasive weed, on the Route 23 side we didn't find anything and the other side there was a little. Clove lake committee has purchase some grills that are over by the beach area. July 12th went to Linden Street and discussed what could be done on that street. July 13th had an audit meeting with Tom Ferry. July 16th there was a ribbon cutting ceremony on Main Street. July 17th Councilwoman Stoll and myself took the Senior of the year award to Julia Devine.

ADMINISTRATORS REPORT

The Administrator/Clerk offered the following report:

Lake Rutherford Pipeline

The State Agricultural Development Committee has indicated to the Borough that the Lake Rutherford Pipeline project will not be on their agenda for the July 28th meeting but will be scheduled for the August 25th meeting.

Goods and Services

The NJDOT will be replacing the handicap ramps along Route 284, and has established an escrow account of \$3,000.00 to insure these changes do not affect the water/sewer utility. The Borough will be executing a contract with Houser Engineering to review all plans to ensure the protection of the utility.

Houser Engineering received a three month extension for the ArcGIS. This is the geographic information system that allows the engineer as well as the DPW access a central data base to map and manage utility information. The Borough will be renewing this contract before September for a cost of \$5,950.00.

The Borough will be replacing the banners along Main Street before the Fireman's Parade at a cost of approximately \$1,200.00. We will be meeting with representatives from Main Street to discuss the banners layout.

<u>Miscellaneous</u>

The Mill Street parking will be restriped this Friday July 22nd. The Borough has purchased a line striper so all work will be done in-house by the DPW.

Clove Lake will be lowered by four feet beginning on October 14th and will start to be refilled on October 31st. This action was requested by the Clove Lake/Brook Maintenance Committee to allow lakefront properties to perform maintenance of the shoreline.
